

How to make... 2D Shape Pictures

Suitable for ages 5 - 11 independent working

You will need:

- White and coloured paper
- Drawing Pencil
- Coloured pens, pencils or paints
- Scissors
- Ruler (or something with a straight edge)
- Glue (or a camera)
- Compass (or something circular to draw around, like a cup or bottle top)



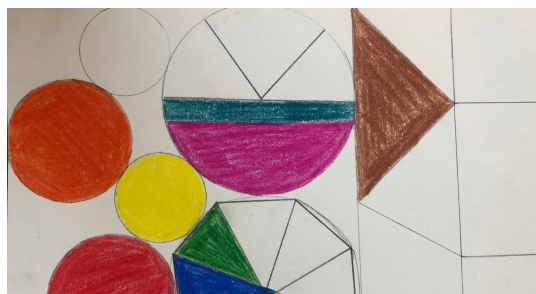
Make your Maths school work more creative with this geometry art activity. Learn your shapes whilst making fun pictures. The possibilities are endless!

Instructions

Step 1:

How many shapes can you name? See if you can name 10. Try researching some more online. How many sides do they have? What might you need to draw each shape?

Using your ruler, compass or objects, draw lots of shapes of different sizes onto your plain paper.



Step 2:

Colour your shapes in and cut them out.

Step 3:

Place your shapes onto your coloured paper and play around with positioning them to make a picture. You could make an animal, a landscape, people - whatever you like!



Step 5:

Once you're happy with a picture, stick your shapes down with glue, or take a photo then make another picture!



One step further:

You could even make a stop motion animation with your shapes! There are lots of apps available online.
