

How to make... an origami wolf

Suitable for ages 6 - 11

You will need:

- Plain paper (square)
- Scissors
- Glue stick
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Felt tip pens

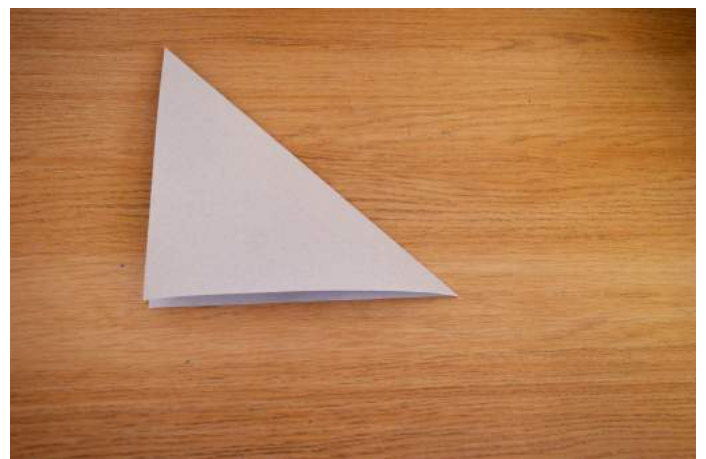
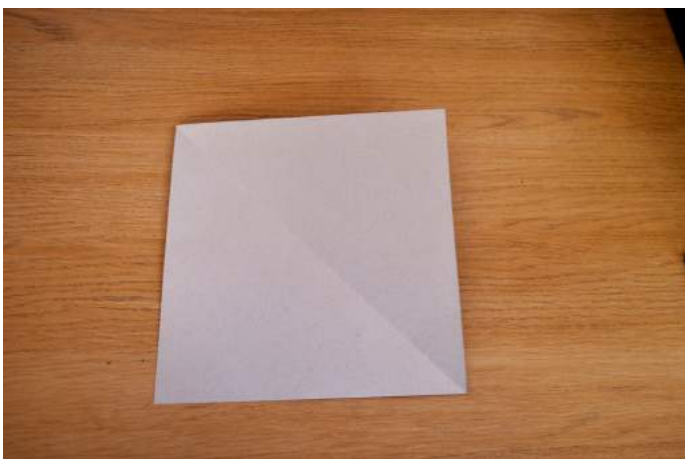


If you enjoyed Jon Barton's reading of *Red Riding Hood and the Wolf*, why not try making your own origami wolf? Origami is the ancient art of paper folding.

Instructions

Step 1:

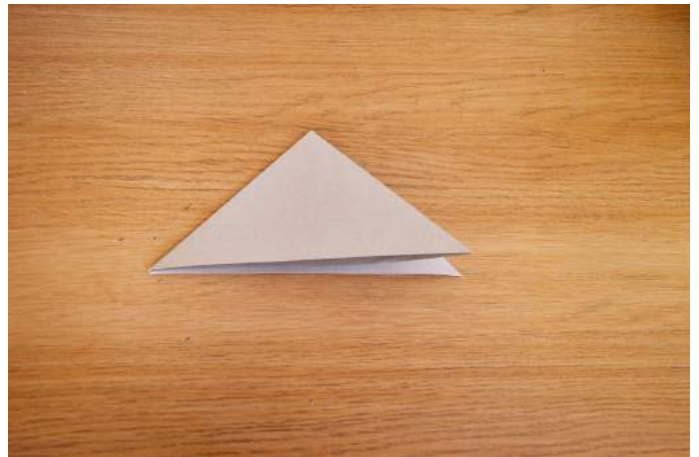
Fold a square piece of paper in half diagonally.



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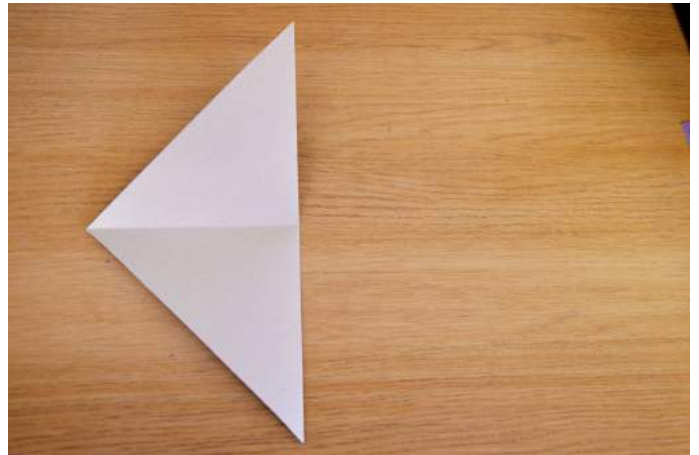
Step 2:

Fold it in half again.



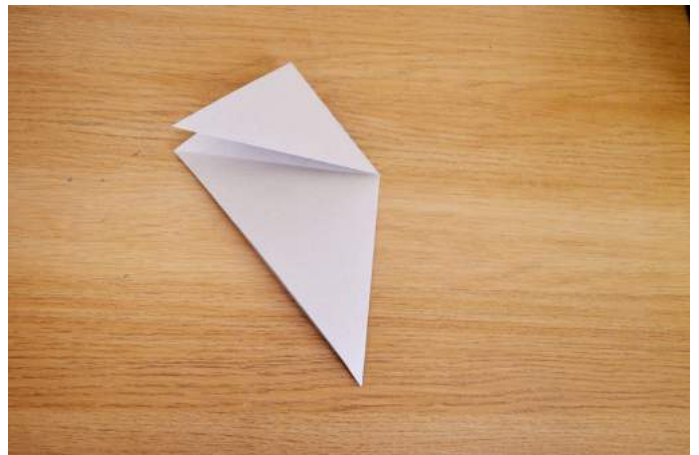
Step 3:

Now pull back the fold you just made and you will see it has a crease line.



Step 4:

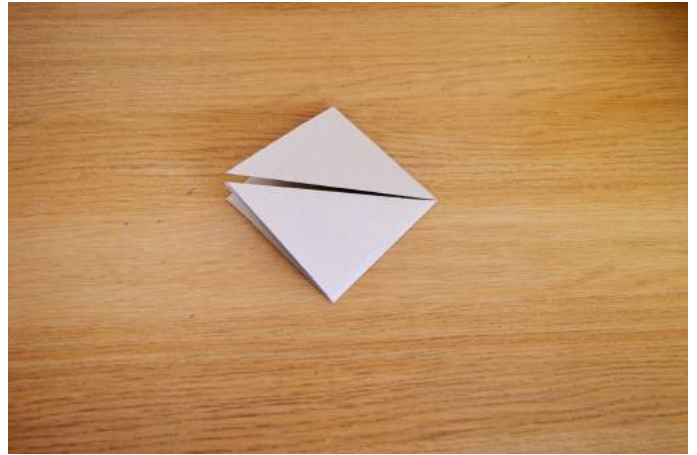
At the top of the paper, bring the tip and fold it to the middle tip.



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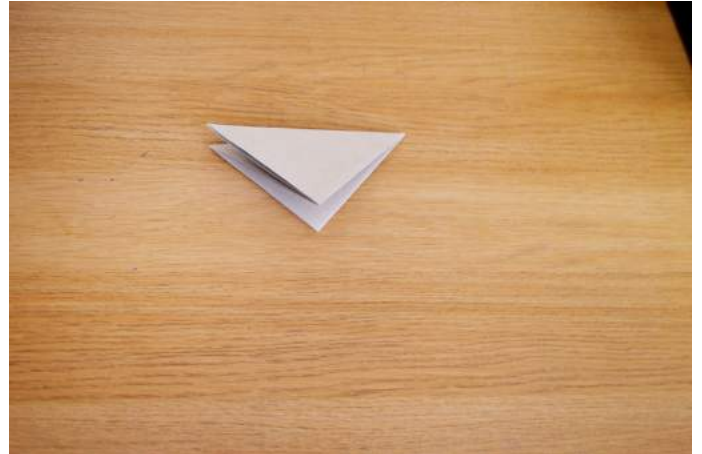
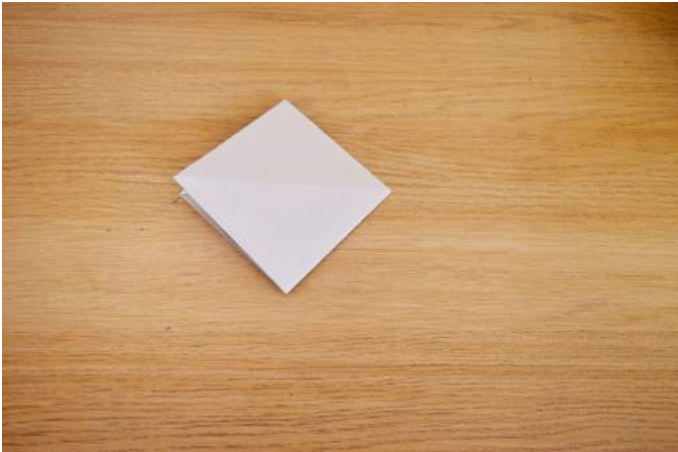
Step 5:

Do the same on the bottom of the paper, bringing the bottom tip to the middle tip.



Step 6:

Turn the whole paper over and fold the tip of the paper half way down.



Step 7:

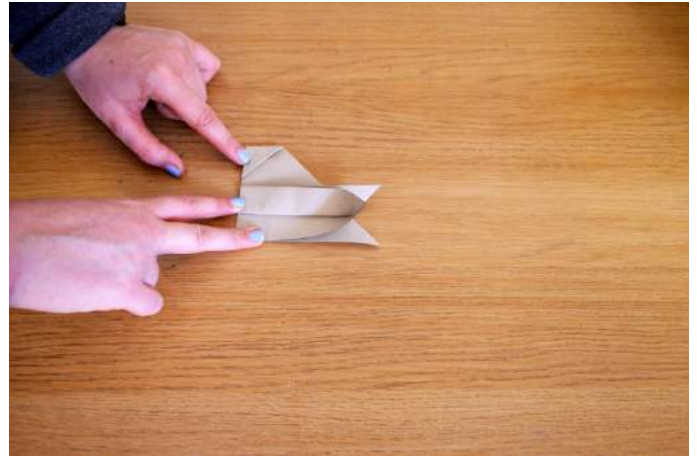
Turn the paper 90 degrees and fold the top tip down.



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Step 8:

Next, fold the bottom of the paper over, spreading the two inner pages out.



Step 9:

Stand it up and add any more details if you want. For example, we added a small white circle to put onto the belly and small white triangles to go on top of the ears.



Step 10:

Use a felt tip pen to add the eyes and nose, and there you have it, your very own wolf!
