

How to make... an Easter daffodil

Suitable for ages 6 - 11 independent working

Suitable for ages 3 - 5 with adult help

You will need:

- White paper
- Yellow/orange/green pencils or pens
- Glue stick or PVA
- Cake cases or yellow/orange/white tissue paper
- Lollipop stick

Brighten up your home this Easter with these sunshine yellow daffodils. You will be making these daffodils out of paper, so they will stay in bloom for a long time to come!

Instructions

Step 1:

Draw your flower petals. Colour them in and cut them out.

Step 2:

Use your flower as a template. Draw around it so you have another flower. Colour this in and cut it out as well.

Step 3:

Slightly bend your petals inwards.



Step 4:

Glue one flower on top of the other.



Step 5:

Scrunch up your cake case and stick it in the middle. Alternatively, scrunch tissue paper or use normal paper.

Step 6:

Colour a lollipop stick green and glue on the back of the daffodil. Alternatively, you can tape a wooden skewer, paper straw, rolled up paper or newspaper or even a green pencil to your flower.



What a beautiful flower you've made!

Now you've made one, you can make lots more and display them in a glass jar or cup.
