# How to make... a raven puppet

Suitable for ages 4 - 7

#### You will need:

- Card
- Paper
- Split pins (paper fasteners)
- String
- Hole puncher
- Scissors
- Glue
- Access to a printer (optional)
- Colouring pens or pencils
- Tape

Are you feeling inspired by Laura Doble's reading of *The Seven Ravens*? Why not try making this charming little flapping bird puppet. You could make it an all black raven like in the story or make a colourful feathered friend.




#### Instructions

# Step 1:

On a piece of card, draw two big circles and one smaller one. (We drew around a roll of tape and a jam jar lid.) Divide one of the larger circles in half - these form your wings. You could draw more detail on these to create a feathery shape like in the template.


#### OR

Print out our template and stick it to card.




# How to make... a raven puppet


**Step 2:** Colour in your pieces, then cut them out.



Step 3:
Stick the small circle to the top of the big one.
These are the body and head of your bird.



**Step 4:**Punch a hole on both sides of the body, just below the head.




**Step 5:**Punch a hole at the tip of the wings and one a little further down. They are marked on the template.


## Step 6:

Push a split pin through the hole in the body and then the second hole on the wing. Open up the pin to fasten it into place. Repeat with the other wing.



# Step 7:

Cut a length of string and thread it through the two top holes in the wings and tie the end in a knot. Try to make sure that the wings are lying as tucked into the body as they can while you tie the knot.



# Step 8:

Cut another length of string. Fold it in half and tie the ends together to form a loop. Tape this to the back of the head.



## Step 9:

Turn your bird over and finish off any decorating. Add a little beak and some claws.
