

How to make... a rolling toy

Suitable for ages 5 - 11

You will need:

- Access to a printer
- Plain paper
- Colouring pencils or felt tip pens
- Tape
- Scissors
- Glue
- Thin card (cereal box)



If you enjoyed Bryn Fitch's reading of *The Hunchbacked Old Woman*, why not recreate the story with this rolling toy.

Set up an obstacle course with ramps and jumps and see if your grandma survives!

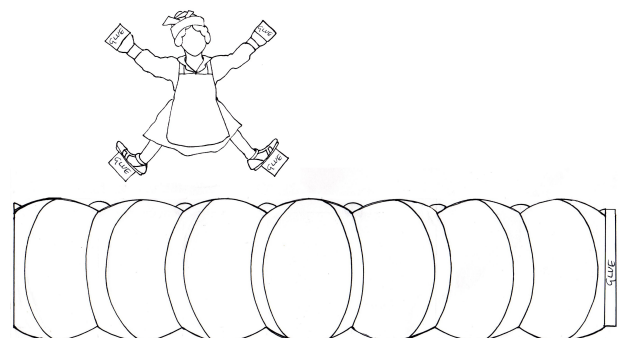
Instructions

Step 1:

Choose one of our templates and print it out.

If you are using Template 1, add your own details by drawing on top. Add clothing to your person and turn your wheel into anything you like.

In keeping with the story, we have made the person the hunchbacked old woman and the wheel a pumpkin.



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Step 2:

Colour it in using colouring pencils or felt tip pens.



Step 3:

Cut out your pieces roughly and stick them to your card.



Step 4:

Cut out all your pieces.



Step 5:

Glue or tape your pumpkin together into a circle.



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Step 6:

Fold back the tabs on the grandma's hands and feet.



Step 7:

Put lots of glue on the tabs and stick your grandma into the inside of your pumpkin.

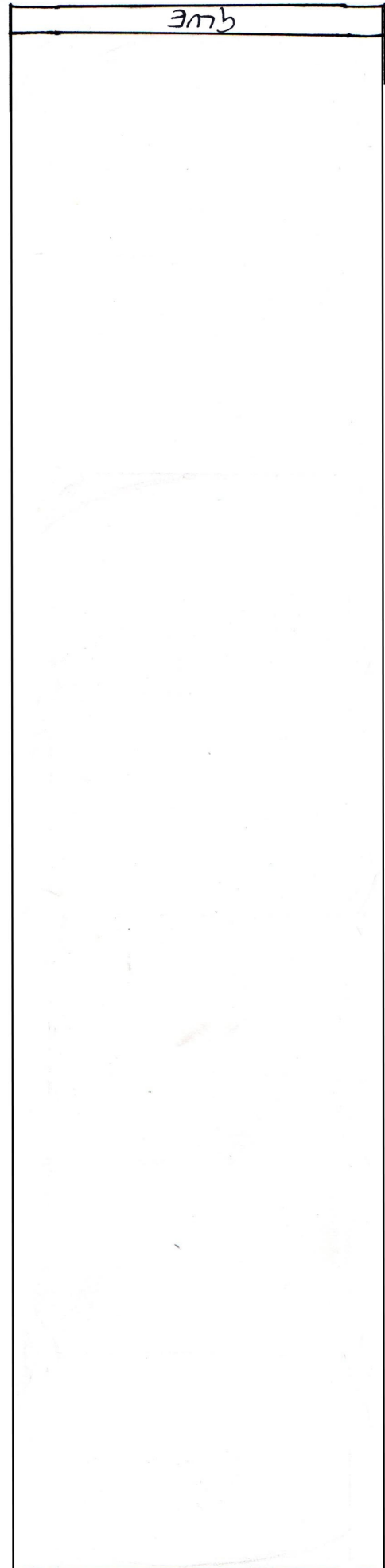
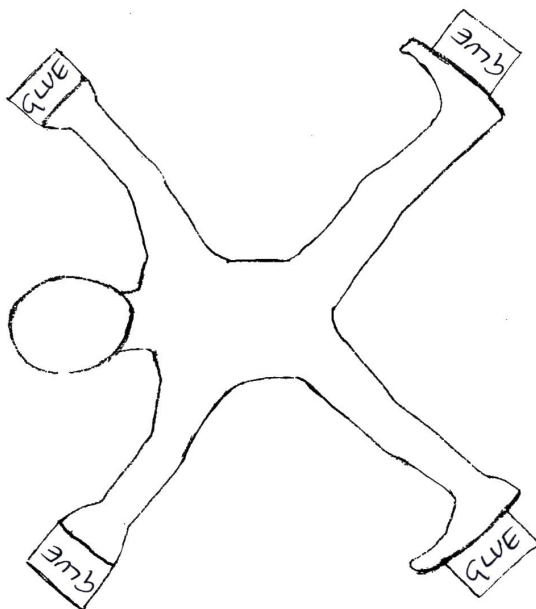


Great work!

Extra steps:

- You could decorate the inside of your wheel/pumpkin. Stick some more paper to the other side of your card strip and colour it in before glueing it together.
- Create an obstacle course of ramps and jumps and see how far your grandma will roll!
- You could tape a penny to the inside of your wheel and see how that affects the speed.
- Why not make a few and have races?
