A core part of our local Community Engagement programme is the school partnerships we hold with eight local primary schools. Schools who are part of the programme have access to a wealth of opportunities and resources to enrich pupils' artistic engagement and support teachers to enliven and enhance the curriculum.


We are also developing our national school partnership offer, including rolling out a new literacy project inspired by our production of Charlie Cook's Favourite Book, which is touring throughout the country in 2024.

CORE DUTIES

The Role

Little Angel Theatre is recruiting a creative person with experience in project management, producing and schools engagement and who has an interest in theatre and literacy to manage our national literacy project and our local Schools Partnership Programme, as well as supporting the development of a national schools Partnership Programme.

National Literacy Project – Reading Through Play



Our Reading Through Play project will reach children across the UK, specifically outside of London as participants in schools - in order to support the levelling up agenda by specifically targeting children with low arts engagement. Through the workshops in schools we aim to reach disadvantaged children via targeted schools recruitment. We will be visiting ACE priority areas, where we will be developing schools audiences by engagement in this project.

This is a project about reading and the joy of reading. The school workshop element of Reading Through Play addresses this head on – children will participate in a play-based workshop, giving them creative agency and innovative routes into exploring literature; and it gives teachers and parents the confidence to use creative activities to help their children enjoy books.

LAT specialises in making shows for this age, and running play-based workshops. Our approach to creating any work with children is collaborative and reflective. The workshop will be tested with LAT's partner schools to ensure that they allow agency for the children, support key curriculum areas for the teachers, and inspire a love of reading.

This role is responsible for managing the roll out of the national schools engagement workshop of the 'Charlie Cook' National Literacy Project.

Local Schools Partnership Programme

This role also involves managing the communication and delivery of the work we do within the partnerships we hold with eight local schools which includes:

- A theatre visit for every pupil in the school;
- After-school puppet clubs for targeted pupils;
- CPD sessions for teachers;
- Puppet making & performing workshops;
- Career and behind the scenes opportunities at the theatre, demonstrating the arts as a viable career option;
- Performances in school;
- Opportunities to see R&D/feed into work-in-progress.

Principal Areas of responsibility:

- To manage the organisation and delivery of the school workshop element of the Charlie Cook national tour literacy project.
- To work with the Head of Creative Learning to manage our local School Partnership Programme.
- To coordinate and manage freelance staff and occasionally support with the delivery of workshops in schools.
- To manage budgets related to the relevant projects.
- To support with the development of a national Schools Partnership Programme.
- To build relationships with schools and venues.

Administration

- Day-to-day administration relating to the Schools Programme, including responding to general enquiries via phone, post and email
- To build a national schools database
- Attendance at all staff meetings
- To be responsible for monitoring and evaluation for the Schools Partnership Programme and National Literacy tour including supporting the development team with funding related tasks associated with the projects.
- To represent the company as and when required at performances, workshops, and other networking events.
