Little Angel Theatre (LAT) has used puppetry to create and share inspiring stories since opening its doors in 1961; igniting the imaginations of the youngest minds. The theatre's success has been built upon a spirit of artistic innovation. We are committed to pushing the boundaries of what puppetry can be, whilst preserving its heritage. Not only do we produce our own shows for children and young people, which play in-house and tour nationally and internationally, we also welcome puppetry companies from around the UK and overseas to perform on our stages.

Alongside our work on stage, our creative learning department delivers imaginative education and participatory activities in our venues, in schools and in community settings.

LAT aims to fuel the imagination through the magic and wonder of puppetry. It does this on stage, on screen, in schools, in the community and through training and professional development.

### Royal & Derngate, Northampton

Royal & Derngate, Northampton, is the main venue and entertainment for arts Northamptonshire. As one of the major producing venues in the country, it won Regional Theatre of the Year in The Stage Awards 2011, was nominated again for the same award in 2016 and for Theatre of the Year in 2022, and was named "Outstanding Regional Theatre" by Michael Billington in Country Life in 2021. Its production of The Worst Witch (one of many recent London transfers) won the 2020 Olivier Award for Best Family Show. Recent highlights include Our Lady of Kibeho (nominated for the 2020 Olivier Award for Outstanding Achievement in an Affiliate Theatre), Ralph Fiennes' world premiere stage adaptation of T.S. Eliot's Four Quartets and the new musical Gin Craze!, named one of the highlights of 2021 in The Guardian, WhatsOnStage and The Stage.

### **Watershed Productions**

Watershed Productions is an independent theatre production company which takes great theatre for children and their families to theatres across the UK and beyond. Highlights of our past work include Charlie and Lola's Best Bestest Play, Charlie and Lola's Extremely New Play, Horrid Henry – Live and Horrid!, Michael Rosen's Chocolate Cake, Winnie the Witch, Charlotte's Web – the Musical! and stage version of several books by Jacqueline Wilson: Double Act, Midnight, Bad Girls and The Suitcase Kid.

### JULIA DONALDSON - Author

Julia Donaldson is the author of some of the world's best-loved children's books. including modern classics 'The Gruffalo' and 'The Gruffalo's Child', which together have sold over 17 million copies worldwide, and the hugely successful 'What the Ladybird Heard' adventures. Julia also writes fiction, including the Princess Mirror-Belle books illustrated by Lydia Monks, as well as poems, plays and songs - and her brilliant live shows are always in demand. She was Children's Laureate 2011-13 and has been honoured with a CBE for Services to Literature. Julia and her husband Malcolm divide their time between West Sussex and Edinburgh.

### LYDIA MONKS - Illustrator

Lydia Monks is one of the most original and bestselling picture book artists working today. Lydia illustrates several bestselling series including the What the Ladybird Heard adventures and Princess Mirror-Belle, written by Julia Donaldson. Her distinctive use of colour and collage has won her critical acclaim and several awards, including the Royal Mail Scottish Children's Book Award, the Stockport Children's Book Award and multiple nominations for the Kate Greenaway Medal. Mouse's Big Day, written and illustrated by Lydia, is the first book in her Twit Twoo School series. Lydia lives in Sheffield.

### SAMANTHA LANE -

### Co-Adaptor & Original Director

Samantha Lane began her tenure as Artistic Director at Little Angel Theatre in 2015. She was formerly Director of Projects at the Almeida Theatre where she made theatre for, by and with young people aged 14-25; and Education Manager at the Queen's Theatre, Hornchurch, where she created numerous Theatre-inprimaru Education for shows secondary schools, as well as directing community plays with casts of 60+ people. During her time at LAT, she has commissioned and programmed over 150 shows, and adapted/directed over 10 of these.

### BARB JUNGR - Co-Adaptor & Composer

Jungr is award winning Barb an international performer, recording artist, composer and lyricist. Her work in children's and family theatre as lyricist, composer, co-writer and co-adapter for Little Angel the 2023 Theatre includes nominated The Smartest Giant in Town, There May Be A Castle, The Singing Mermaid, The Pixie and the Pudding, The Fabulous Flutterbus, and We're Going on a Bear Hunt. She co-wrote the script and composer for Mother Christmas (Little Angel short film and Dare (Polka). Other work as composer and lyricist includes Chocolate Cake, How to Hide a Lion and Jack V Giant (Polka Theatre); and lyricist/writer Liverpool Birds Flying Home (Royal Court Theatre, Liverpool); lyricist Jungle Book (Birmingham Stage Company) and Soho Songs (Crazy Coqs, London) and for the song cycle Mabel Stark Tiger Tamer.

### **OLIVER HYMANS - Associate Director**

award-winning Hymans is an puppetry artist and director. He has internationally four worked across continents. directina and designing puppetry in theatre, opera, film and music video. Oliver's puppets have appeared at London's Tate Modern, Arcola Theatre, Royal Albert Hall, The National Gallery, Camden Roundhouse and The Institute of Contemporary Arts. His shows have been described as being "visually dazzling... funny and beautiful...poetic and precise" (The Guardian), with "dazzling technical flourishes" (The Stage). Design Credits include: The Instrumentals, A Christmas Carol in the Painted Hall, The Legend of the Jazz Penguin (for Goblin Theatre); Rosie Robins and the Christmas Post, Prince Charming, The Wishing Tree (Little Angel Theatre); and many more. Oliver is currently Associate Director at Little Angel Theatre and a 2021 QEST Scholar specialising in traditional marionette carving; in 2023 he was a finalist for Woodworker of the Year in recognition of his successful work to get marionettes added to the Red List of Endangered Crafts.

### SHERRY COENEN - Lighting Designer

Sherry has been lighting shows in the US and UK since graduating with a BFA in Lighting Design from the University of Miami. Shows for Little Angel Theatre include: Scruff, There May Be A Castle, The Singing Mermaid, WOW! It's Night-time, Prince Charming, The Flying Bath, The Bed, The Pixie and the Pudding, I Want My Hat Back Triloau. Other shows include: Operation Mincemeat Diorama (New \*KOI 2019\*; Theatre) nominated Frankenstein (Battersea Arts Centre) \*KOI winner 2019\*.

### LAURA MCEWAN - Designer

Laura McEwen has been designing for theatre for more than twenty years. She has a specialism In designing for young audiences and had worked for national and international companies including the Royal Shakespeare Company, English National Opera, Unicorn Theatre, Polka Theatre and Little Angel Theatre. Her work has toured worldwide across Asia and as far as Sydney Opera House. Most recently she alongside theatre architects worked Foster Wilson in designing the interior of the new Polka Theatre in London, a venue dedicated exclusively to work for young audiences. Laura has had her designs for theatre exhibited at the Victoria and Albert Museum and her work as an artist exhibited at the Roual Academy, London.

### LYNDIE WRIGHT - Puppet Designer

In 1961 Lyndie and John Wright founded Little Angel Theatre. Lyndie was responsible for designing Little Angel Theatre shows as well as making puppets and performing in the productions of the first 40 years. She retired from Little Angel Theatre in 2002, but continues to design and make puppets for theatres including not just Little Angel Theatre, but also the RSC, National Shakespeare's Globe, Opera Theatre. North, Opera Circus, Tamasha, Puppet Theatre, Munich, Polka Players TheatreRites and Kneehigh. Most recently she has made puppets for The Little Matchgirl (Shakespeare's Globe) and Tin Drum (Kneehigh).

### **RUTH CALKIN - Performer**

Ruth has worked extensively at Little Angel over many years, beginning with *The Mouse Queen* back in 2005 and most recently as Gomo in *Prince Charming* earlier this year. She is chuffed to bits to be returning to *The Singing Mermaid*.

Other LAT productions include: The Smartest Giant in Town (Fiery Light, West End); the award-nominated solo performer show The Bed; There May Be a Castle; The Very Old Man with Enormous Wings (Little Angel/Kneehigh) and The Tempest (Little Angel/RSC).

Ruth performed Toodloo in *Twirlywoos Live* (MEI), was original cast (then puppetry director) for *In The Night Garden Live* and has worked with other renowned companies such as Oily Cart and Theatre-Rites. TV includes Puppetry Development Lead for CBeebies' *Moon & Me*.

#### LOUISE MELLOR - Performer

Louise previously performed in The Singing Mermaid, UK tour. She is delighted to be back on the show, this time as Annie, making her debut here at the Little Angel Theatre. She trained at the Curious School of Puppetry, and in Physical Theatre at the Accademia dell'Arte in Italy. Louise has performed in numerous children's and theatre productions, touring both nationally and internationally. Previous credits include Firebird (Bamboozle Theatre); The Magic Beanstalk (Light Theatre/Eden Project); Lily & the Heron, Ikura & the Mud Giant, Beyond the Teapot (Goofus Theatre); Finding Joy, The Best Thing (Vamos Theatre). She toured various fairytales such as Alice in Wonderland, Robin Hood and Peter Pan to schools around Italy, and as a storyteller worked with Whispering Wood Folk on The Boy Who Grew Wings and Pass it On. Louise has also worked in Bangladesh and Greece with Clowns Without Borders.

### ALEX HOBBS - Stage Manager

Alex is a graduate from Guildhall School of Music and Drama.
